To be registered, participants must have a 4-H Enrollment Form, a current Medical Release Form, a Summer Fun Registration Form, and payment in full.

Application/Resume/Interview/Essay

Also known as ARIE, this program encourages youth to go through the process of filling out an application, creating a resume, writing an essay, and going through an interview with the end result being competent and confident young people acquiring admissions to college, scholarships, and

jobs. Applications, resumes and essays are due to Beth by May 8th and interviews will be conducted at NC 4-H Congress in July.

Youth must be at least 14 years old to compete for a trip to National 4-H Congress or National 4-H Conference. However, youth

ages 11-13 can participate in Mock ARIE.
