I challenge you to make a difference in your community, your country, and your world.

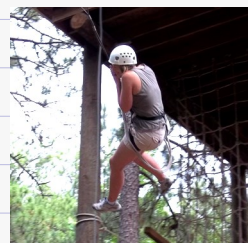
I challenge you to make your best better.

Summer Updates

4-H Electric Congress

Eryn Haynes attended the 68th annual 4-H Electric Congress July 13-15 at the University of North Carolina Wilmington. While at Electric Congress, participants put together an electric kit, went to the beach, had a dinner cruise, and dance. 180 4-H'ers, adult leaders and N.C. Cooperative Extension agents from 54 counties attended the three-day event. Since 1947, Duke Energy and Dominion North Carolina Power have sponsored the annual congress to emphasize energy conservation and safe electricity use. 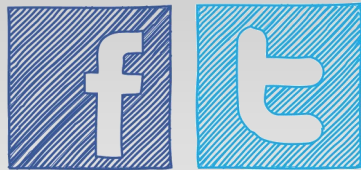

Extension Happenings

Farm Tour Cancelled

The Person County Cooperative Extension and the Person County Museum of History have decided to cancel the 4th Annual Farm Tour, which was to be held September 26-27. The reason for the cancellation is to protect poultry flocks from a possible outbreak of seasonal Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI).

Upon learning of the cancellation of the Eastern Triangle Farm Tour, the Person County tour organizers contacted the State Veterinarian's office

and learned that the NCDA&CS strongly recommended cancelling the Person County tour due to the possibility of transmitting the disease to Person County flocks. The State Veterinarian has already cancelled all poultry shows and sales through January 15, 2016 due to the threat of HPAI. The committee felt the moral, ethical and professional decision required cancelling the tour in order to minimize the risk to poultry in Person County and in the state.

The September Lunch N' Learn is scheduled for Thursday, **September 24** from noon until 1:00 pm and will focus on ovarian cancer. The cost is \$5.00 to attend and you must pre-register by September 21.
